• WAS to Archive-it Transition. We have been working with Archive-it staff to successfully test and document the migration process. Russian Politics Web Archive, UCLA Library



This web archive captures blogs, editorials and other materials posted online by, or on behalf of, 17 Russian political and cultural figures who have expressed some opposition to foreign and domestic policy in Vladimir Putin's Russia. The archive also captures eight websites that chronicle a range of contemporary political and human rights positions and events that reflect the prevailing climate.
